Extroverts vs. Introverts

Where do you prefer to focus your attention? Where do you get energy?

- Extraversion: focus on the outer world of people and things
- Introversion: focus on the inner world of ideas and impressions

Sensation vs. Intuition

How do you take in information?

- Sensing: focus on the present and on concrete information gained from your senses
- Intuition: focus on the future, with a view toward patterns and possibilities

Thinking vs. Feeling

How do you make decisions?

- Thinking: base your decisions primarily on logic and on objective analysis of cause and effect
- Feeling: base your decisions primarily on values and on subjective evaluation of person-centered concerns

Judging vs. Perceiving

How do you deal with the outer world?

- Judging: like a planned and organized approach to life and prefer to have things settled
- Perceiving: like a flexible and spontaneous approach to life and prefer to keep your options open

A visionary; seeks complexity; avoids redundancy; appreciates intellectual competency; responds to recognition of his/her capabilities; designer of systems, technical or managerial.

IJ

Decisive introverts; introspective and persevering; they will hang tough because they have made up their minds; they will need evidence that fits with their internal perceptions if they are going to change; bulwarks; determined.

INTJ (Coordinators)

Have original minds and great drive for implementing their ideas and achieving their goals. Quickly see patterns in external events and develop long-range explanatory perspectives. When committed, organize a job and carry it through. Skeptical and independent, have high standards of competence and performance – for themselves and others.
